I Corinthians 3:18-23 We Belong To Christ

Introduction:

When we say we belong to a particular family, we mean we are born members and therefore are blood related. When we say we belong to a particular club we mean to say we have paid the dues and we meet the qualifications and therefore have all the rights and privileges. When we say we belong to a particular employment or business we mean to say we labor in order to produce a product or service, and therefore receive the necessary wages or reward for our good work.

When we say we belong to Christ we mean, He has become our mediator and has reconciled us to God through the sacrifice on the cross. Christ's very blood has paid the ransom to God and thereby makes us members of God's family through adoption. (Eph. 5:20)
